



Update from Georgia Water Network

GWN Invites You to facility tour of **Hickory Log Creek Dam and River Pumping Station**

The Hickory Log Creek Reservoir is a joint project between the City of Canton and Cobb County-Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) to supplement the area's existing raw water supply—the Etowah River—through 2050.

This dam will be 170 feet high, making it one of largest dams in the state not built by the Corps of Engineers or Georgia Power. The 5 billion gallon reservoir will cover 370 acres and include 15 miles of shoreline. Safe yield has been determined to be 44 million gallons per day (mgd), which will be shared by Canton and the CCMWA. In addition to the dam and reservoir, the project includes a river intake and pumping station and a pipeline to transport water between the reservoir and the Etowah River.

The Brown and Caldwell team is currently providing program management, design services, and public involvement for the Hickory Log Creek Water Supply Reservoir project.



Although majority of the heavy construction activities have ended, there is inherent risk involved visiting a construction site. Tour attendees are required to wear a hard hat, a safety vest, safety glasses and hard sole shoes and will be responsible for their own safety while touring the sites.

Savannah Harbor ReOxygenation Demonstration Project

Portions of the Savannah River are classified as low in *Dissolved Oxygen* (DO) and GPA's critically-needed harbor-deepening expansion project would further reduce the reaeration capacity of the River system.

ReOxygenation (ReOx) technology in Savannah Harbor could be a feasible solution for DO mitigation. MACTEC assembled, operated, and monitored the ReOx demonstration system during the summer of 2007 considered 'critical season' for testing the overall project's success.

The presentation will provide an overview of the Savannah Harbor ReOxygenation Demonstration Project and findings from the pilot studies conducted in the Savannah River harbor.

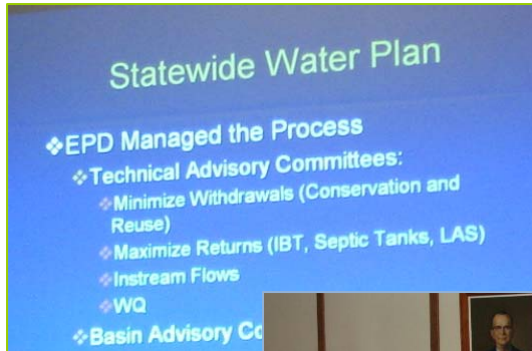

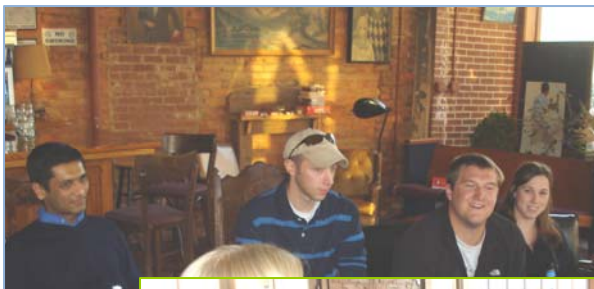
Past Event Update
